Commercial Transportation from the Airport

If you choose to use commercial transportation from **Narita Airport**, here's what you need to know:

Bus Tickets:

- Visit the **commercial bus ticket booth** inside **Terminal 1**, near **Bus Stop #8**.
- Average cost to **Yokohama Station**: **¥3,600**
- Note: Pets are not allowed on public transportation in Japan.



Continuing to NAF Atsugi:

- From Yokohama Station, take a train to Sagamino Station.
- NAF Atsugi is located about **1 mile** from Sagamino Station.
- **Taxis** are readily available outside the station for the short ride to base.

Military Working Dog, Service Animal, and Personal Pet Policy

MILITARY WORKING DOGS

Military working dogs and Police K9 animals are permitted in NHG Hotels at any time and are not required to pay a cleaning fee, provide documentation or immunization records.

PERSONAL PETS

All guests with a personal pet(s) will be charged the appropriate pet fee. Pet agreement and immunization records are required at check-in. Pets are defined as dogs and cats. Rooms will be served in a first come, first serve basis

SERVICE ANIMALS

Service animals are not pets. A place of public accommodation is not allowed to ask for documentation or proof that the animal has been certified, trained, or licensed as a service animal.

A guest with a service animal may be asked two questions:

- 1. Is the animal required because of a disability?
- 2. What work or task has the animal been trained to perform for you?

EMOTIONAL SUPPORT, COMFORT, THERAPY ANIMALS

Emotional support animals, comfort animals, and therapy animals are not service animals under Title II and Title III of the ADA. A note from a physician does not turn an animal into a Service Animal. Therefore, the pet fee, pet agreement and immunization records are required at check-in.

Housing Services

Military Member Eligibility:

NAF Atsugi stationed personnel with accompanying bona fide family members who have received dependency status and/or dependent entry approval, and will reside with the sponsor for nine consecutive months or more each year. The following are the documents required for you to apply for Military Family Housing (MFH).

- 1. Housing application DD Form 1746
- 2. PCS Orders
- 3. Dependent Entry Approval or Command Sponsorship Approval
- 4. Detaching Information Report (L20/L01 Activity Loss, from last Permanent Duty Station (PDS))
- 5. Page 2 (Record of Emergency Data (RED))
- 6. Marriage Certificate (married after arrival member)
- 7. Pregnancy Certificate (single pregnant member)
- 8. Valid Power of Attorney (POA) for your spouse or representative if sponsor is absent.

Note: When you apply for MFH, other supporting documents maybe required on a case-by-case basis

Civilian Member Eligibility:

Civilians assigned to NAF Atsugi who have transportation agreement, drawing Living Quarters Allowance (LQA), and are accompanied with Command Sponsored bona fide family members who will reside with the sponsor for nine consecutive months or more each year are eligible to make application for MFH. Application does not guarantee assignment. The following are the documents required for you to apply for MFH.

- 1. Housing Application DD Form 1746
- 2. DoW Travel Orders
- 3. Transportation Agreement DD Form 1617
- 4. Letter of Employment
- 5. Dependent Entry Approval or Command Sponsorship Approval if applicable 6. SF50
- 6. Valid POA for your spouse or representative if sponsor is absent

Note 1: When you apply for MFH, other supporting documents maybe required on a case-by-case basis

Note 2: Civilian employees normally will be expected to rely on surrounding civilian communities for housing support whether stationed in the Contiguous United States (CONUS), Hawaii, U.S. territories and possessions, or foreign areas. Where the Housing Authority (HA) determines appropriate and adequate community services and support facilities do not exist, are substandard, or cannot be enjoyed without restriction, housing will be allocated to provide reasonable and equitable treatment to both eligible military personnel and eligible U.S. citizen civilian employees. Where applicable, Fair Market Rental rates will be established in accordance with local instruction. Local HA will establish policy for collection of rental payment.

Check-In Procedure

- **In-person reporting**: You will be placed on the waiting list **after** reporting to your command.
- **Required**: Service member, spouse, or authorized representative (with POA) must bring required documents to the housing office.
- The **housing counselor** will handle reviews, offers, and assignments.

Deployed Members

- Applications may be submitted via letter, fax, email, or by a designated POA holder.
- Indicate that the unit is deployed.
- You must report to AHSC within 30 days of return from deployment.

Advance Application

You may submit your application and required documents in advance. However, your name will not be added to the waiting list until:

- You have **physically arrived** at NAF Atsugi,
- Reported to your new command, and
- Completed the housing application process with a counselor.
- Website: Navy Housing HEAT Tool

Bedroom Entitlement

Bedroom entitlement is based on pay grade and family composition:

- Example: Member + spouse + 2 children = 3-bedroom unit
- **O6 and above**: Minimum 4-bedroom
- O4–O5, W2–W5, LDOs, E7–E9, and officers with 9+ years enlisted: Minimum 3-bedroom regardless of family size

Control Date & Waiting List Placement

Military Members

- Control date = Detachment date from last duty station
- Apply within 30 days of reporting to new command
- Older control date = higher priority on waiting list
- Late applications result in a walk-in control date and no funded local move

Civilian Employees

- Control date = Effective date on SF-50
- Same 30-day application requirement
- Failure to meet deadline results in **no funded local move**

House Offer & Assignment

- Placement is based on pay grade and bedroom eligibility
- No preferences (location, style, pet-friendly) are considered for the **first offer**
- You may:
 - Accept the first offer
 - Refuse and wait for a second offer based on your preference
 - Refusing the second offer moves you to bottom of list
 - Control date resets to reapplication date

Important!

Refusing the first offer:

- Ends Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA) 30 days after refusal or earliest move-in date
- May result in **out-ofpocket lodging expenses**
- Requires self-funded HHG move back to base housing

Pets

- Contact housing before arrival if bringing pets, especially dogs
- On-base pet-friendly housing is limited
- Max 2 registered pets (cats/dogs) allowed
- Pets must be registered at Camp Zama Vet Facility

Family Arrival Delay

- Family must arrive within **30 days** of move-in
- BAH, LQA, OHA, and TLA will be terminated on move-in date

Temporary Lodging Allowance (TLA)

- Begins when member reports and applies for housing
- Max duration: **60 days**
- TLA stops 30 days after declining first offer
- TLA is reimbursed every 10 days
- Must show sincere effort to obtain off-base housing

- Full HHG weight allowance is authorized to Atsugi
- **Not recommended** to bring large, bulky furniture due to small Japanese homes. Utilize Non Temp storage option while booking PCS move.
- No commercial on-base storage space available. Out in town self-storage is expensive & hard to arrange.

- Visits >72 hours must be pre-approved in writing
- Max guest stay: 60 days per year (non-sponsored visitors)
- Additional guest pass restrictions apply to sponsors receiving housing allowances

Child Development Center (CDC)

Children must:

- Be current on required immunizations.
- Have a completed registration packet and proof of **Total Family Income** (TFI).
- Be registered on militarychildcare.com.
- Complete a CDC orientation before the start date.
- Infants & Toddlers (6 wks 35 mos): Bring diapers, wipes, and two changes of clothes. Call us about food prep rules.
- DoDEA Universal Pre-K and Kindergarten have options for before/after school care with the CDC
- 5-Year-Olds Enrolled in DoDEA School: Must use the Youth Center for before/after school care, not the CDC.

Cost for the CDC

- No annual registration fee
- Payment due on the 1st and 15th of each month
- **TFI is verified** using:
 - Sponsor's most recent **LES** (includes base pay, BAS, BAH—even if living off base)
 - o Spouse's most recent pay stub

Age Requirements for DoDEA School Enrollment

To enroll in a DoDEA school, your child must meet the following age requirements by September 1:

- 4 years old Pre-Kindergarten or Sure Start
- 5 years old Kindergarten
- 6 years old First Grade


On-Base Transportation

Driving in Japan

Driving Requirements:

To operate a motor vehicle in Japan under SOFA (Status of Forces Agreement), you must:

- 1. Attend a **Driver's Safety Briefing** (provided during AOB)
- 2. Obtain a **SOFA License** upon successful completion of the written driving exam and AOB/ICR.
- 3. Carry both your SOFA license and your stateside driver's license (or international driver's permit).

Important Notes:

- **Driving is on the left-hand side** of the road.
- Japanese road signs can differ; study the road signs and local laws carefully.
- Children under age 6 must be in approved car seats.
- Avoid using cell phones while driving—hands-free devices are a must.

Vehicle Registration Process

If you plan to purchase a vehicle, the **Vehicle Registration Office** at NAF Atsugi will assist you in completing the following steps:

1. Obtain Japanese Compulsory Insurance (JCI):

Required for all vehicles in Japan.

2. Liability Insurance:

Your insurance must cover Japanese requirements.

3. Road Tax and Weight Tax:

Must be paid annually. Fees vary based on vehicle size and type.

4. Base Registration:

You must register your vehicle with the **Pass & ID Office** and receive a **base decal**.

5. Vehicle Safety Inspection:

Required every 2 years. Older vehicles may require more frequent inspections and maintenance to stay compliant.

6. Title Transfer:

If buying a used vehicle locally, ensure the transfer is handled correctly with all associated paperwork.

Important Restrictions & Reminders

- **Parking Requirements:** You must have a designated parking space (off-base) before registering a vehicle.
- Motorcycles: Require additional licensing, safety training, and gear inspections.

Bicycles and Public Transit

- Bicycles are a popular option for local commuting. They must be registered at the VRO. Helmets are mandatory on base, and bicycle insurance is highly encouraged.
- Train and bus systems near Atsugi (Sagamino and Sagami-Otsuka stations) are safe, reliable, and punctual.
- IC cards (PASMO/SUICA) make it easy to ride trains and buses without paper tickets.

Alcohol Laws in Japan

While you are here in Japan, you are an ambassador for the United States as well as a representative of the U.S. Navy. The legal age for consuming alcohol in Japan is 20 years old. If you have a **BAC of 0.03** or higher and operate a motor vehicle you are considered to be driving under the influence.

Driving Under the Influence (DUI)

If a driver is pulled over by the Japanese Police while operating a motor vehicle and signs of intoxication are observed or an odor of an alcoholic beverage is emitting from the driver that individual and **all other occupants** can be charged with an alcohol-related offenses under Japanese law. No matter the outcome of a DUI, the penalty is always heavy. Japanese authorities can detain offenders for days, months or even years depending on the violation. Time in captivity does not include military pay.

If you are unsure about the registration or licensing process, the FFSC and the Security Office are here to help. Attend the **Area Orientation Brief** for up-to-date details on local regulations and safe travel practices.

- 4. Visit the **TRICARE Office** (located in BHC Atsugi) for in-person support.

Your Responsibility: Be Ready

Emergencies can happen at any time — **preparedness is key**. Each service member and family member is responsible for having the knowledge and supplies to **sustain themselves for at least fourteen days**.

You may be without power, water, or access to base services for an extended period. Emergency Management Plans **assume you can be self-sufficient** with the proper supplies.

What to Include in Your Emergency Kit

Basic Supplies

- Non-perishable food & bottled water (5-day supply)
- Battery-powered or hand-crank radio
- Flashlights and **extra batteries**
- First aid kit with family prescriptions & medications
- Cash (yen and U.S. dollars)

Tools & Utilities

- Whistle
- Wrench or pliers (to shut off utilities)
- Multi-tool or basic hand tools

Personal Items

- Blanket or sleeping bag per person
- Extra clothes & sturdy footwear
- Sanitation supplies (toilet paper, wipes, feminine hygiene, trash bags)
- Items for infants, elderly, disabled, and **pets**

Documents

- Important family documents (passports, birth certificates, orders)
- Store in **fireproof container** and **waterproof bag**

Emergency Evacuation

One of your first steps after arrival should be checking in with your **command's Non-combatant Evacuation Operations (NEO) Warden**. They will help you:

- Complete your **EEP package**
- Understand evacuation procedures
- Prepare a **Go-Kit** for each family member
