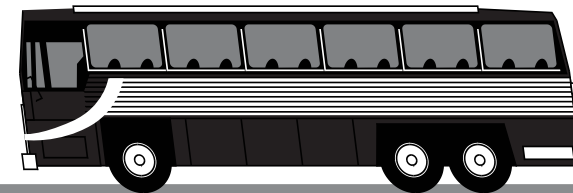

★Minobusan Kuon-ji, Washi Paper Lampshade Craft & Grape Picking | Sat, Sep 5

Cost: \$60 (12 & up) / \$50 (4-11) / \$30 (0-3)

Mount Minobu (1,153m), located in Yamanashi Prefecture, is one of the three great sacred mountains of Japanese Buddhism and home to Kuon-ji Temple, the head temple of the Nichiren sect. Next, we'll head to Kamisuki Park to try our hand at crafting washi paper lampshades, then finish the day picking grapes at Yamanashi Grape Farm.

Admission to scheduled sites is included.

Washi lampshade making is not included for ages 0-3. Recommended item: a towel

Kiyotsu Gorge & Kusatsu Hot Spring Yumomi Show Sat, Sep 12

Cost: \$50 (12 & up) / \$40 (6-11) / \$35 (0-5)

Kiyotsu Gorge Tunnel and Kusatsu offer stunning natural scenery, perfect for taking in the views and snapping photos. Next, we'll enjoy a taste of local culture at the Yumomi show, where performers sing traditional songs while paddling to cool the scalding hot spring water.

Admission fee is included. Recommended item: rain gear



Mishima Skywalk & Zipline Sun, Sep 13

Cost: \$65 (15 & up) / \$60 (9-14)

Reward Points: 100 | Depart: 0700 / Return: 1700

Enjoy stunning views of Mt. Fuji and surrounding areas from Japan's longest suspension bridge and a thrilling zipline course.

Minimum age is 9 years old and maximum height is 140 cm (55 inches). Maximum weight is 100kg (220 lbs). Athletic shoes are required. Children must be accompanied by an adult during the course with no more than two children per adult. Admission fees and Zipline are included.

Cancellation Policy: 50% refund until Aug 27; no refund for cancellations on or after Aug 28.

Recommended items: gloves, athletic shoes, small towel, water, change of clothes, and rain gear

Ochudo Fuji 5th Station Hike Sat, Sep 19

Cost: \$45 | \$36 (Blue Jacket Liberty E1-E5)

Reward Points: 200 | Depart: 0630 / Return: 1930

The Ochudo trail encircles Mt. Fuji at the halfway point, around the 5th Station level (about 2,300 meters / 7,546 feet). Along the way, you'll see not only Mt. Fuji but also nearby lakes and a range of Southern Alps peaks. This is mainly a flat hike with very little ascending or descending. Sightseeing includes Komitake Shrine and Oshino Village.

This tour is not for young children.

Recommended items: comfortable trekking shoes

*Easy / Beginner: Trails are 80% flat and 20% ascending and descending. Total distance: about 6 miles.

Okutama White Water Rafting Sun, Sep 20

Cost: \$65 (15 & up) / \$60 (6-14)

\$52 (Blue Jacket Liberty E1-E5)

Reward Points: 100 | Depart: 0800 / Return: 1700

Enjoy a thrilling rafting trip down the Okutama River. Due to rafting company regulations, the minimum age for this tour is 6 years, and one parent or guardian is required for every two children.

Recommended items: bath towel, change of clothes, bathing suit, and river shoes (or rent them on location).



Nikko Edo Wonderland | Sat, Sep 26

Cost: \$68 (12 & up) / \$50 (6-11) / \$35 (0-5) | \$54 (Blue Jacket Liberty E1-E5)

Reward Points: 400 | Depart: 0600 / Return: 1930

Step back in time to the 17th-century Edo Period, where you might encounter Samurai, Oiran courtesans (upper-class geishas), and Ninja warriors. The village is divided into five areas: Kaido (Road to Edo), Shukaba-machi (Inn Town), Shokagai (Market District), Buke-yashiki (Samurai Residence), and Ninja Village. Dress up in period clothing to experience the culture first-hand.

Admission fees are included.



Joren Waterfalls & Seven Waterfalls Walking Sun, Sep 27

Cost: \$35 | \$28 (Blue Jacket Liberty E1-E5)

Reward Points: 250 | Depart: 0630 / Return: 2000

Experience Joren Waterfall and the Seven Waterfalls walk. The pure waters of the Kawazu River cascade down from the Amagi mountain range in seven dramatic drops, forming the Kawazu Nanadaru trail — a scenic hike that leads from one gushing waterfall to the next.
